



We finished last term with a visit from Julie Richards from Numero. Julie came to the school to go through the rules of Numero with all the students. We all had a great day where some of us learnt how to play, some got a refresher and we all got to play the game, Numero. Numero is an educational maths game designed to improve mental maths. Our students are given opportunities to practice what they have learnt in the classroom.

### **NAPLAN**

On Thursday our year 3 students completed their final NAPLAN assessment. I am fairly confident they are glad it has concluded. Results of NAPLAN will be available to parents of NAPLAN students later in the year.

## ANZAC SERVICE

Our school Anzac Service was held on Thursday of Week 1. The students presented the service along with Digger Brooks who arrived with his trailer of memorabilia. All of our students had the opportunity to walk around and look at the memorabilia and Digger Brooks answered their questions. It was a lovely afternoon.

### SCITECH

Last week we were visited by the Scitech team. Unfortunately, they were unable to get their huge dome up and running, however they presented some fabulous workshops for the students. Everyone had an amazing time and learnt a lot about the planets. Even the staff were involved in becoming planets and moons on the oval. # PARENTS AND CITIZENS MEETING

The parents and citizens meeting that was scheduled for 12 May has been postponed. A new date will be advised soon.

### **COVID UPDATES**

Under the new Health Department protocols, a close contact is now deemed as anyone living in the same house as someone who has tested positive. It is important to note that close contacts can still attend school as long as they don't have any symptoms, they wear a mask to school, and they take a RAT test every morning before arriving at school. We ask that you notify the school if your child is a close contact.

If your child becomes unwell during the school day, we will contact you to collect them even though they may have had a negative test in the morning. We ask that if your child is unwell, that you keep them home and continue testing either by RAT or getting a PCR for peace of mind.

Children testing positive must remain at home and in isolation for 7 days. When you advise the school of a positive test, we will make arrangements for a work package to be sent home. We will then make contact with you and your child whilst they are in isolation to check on how they are going with the work package and to see if there is anything we can do to assist.

### SUPPLY OF RAT'S TO FAMILIES

We have received a supply of RATs to distribute to families. Please contact the school to make arrange a time for you pick up your 20 RATs per student. Unfortunately, we are unable to send the RATs home with students.

### STEPHANIE ALEXANDER KITCHEN

Work has begun in our garden. Thank you to Dylan Tarr who kindly donated his time to burn out the old stumps and use his bobcat to clear the bed so that we have a clean slate to start our project. The students have begun designing what they think it should look like and what sort of vegetables and herbs we should be planting. This is a long-term project that we hope to become a sustainable and integral part of the school in many learning areas. If anyone is a green thumb and has any words of wisdom or suggestions on suitable plants for this time of year please do not hesitate to contact me and have a chat.

### **OZ HARVEST FEAST**

This is a food waste education program that is running in our senior room. It inspires kids to eat healthy, waste less, and become change makers in their local community. The program is aligned to the curriculum and gets kids immersed in hands-on cooking activities in the classroom. Last week the students made banana pancakes. We look forward to see what they are making tomorrow. Don't forget to ask your child what they made, how they made it and what it tasted like.

### PIRATE DAY

Pirate Day coincided with Walk to School Day, so we took a small walk to the Shire offices to parade for the staff there. The students looked great, and a fun day was had. We raised \$84.00 our highest amount so far, thank you to everyone for their generous donations and support for research into childhood brain cancer.


Can I ask that in this world of chaos, i.e. COVID, what's happening in Ukraine, the upcoming elections, that we all take some time to be kind and to take care of each other.
