

9.3 Shire of Trayning Caravan Park Camping Parameters

Objective The primary purpose of the Shire of Trayning Caravan Park is to provide short term accommodation for tourists. This policy seeks to define long-term stay parameters for visitors to the park.

Policy Statement

Legislation

The Shire of Trayning Caravan Park is owned and operated by the Shire of Trayning and is required to operate within the scope of the Caravan Parks and Camping Grounds Act 1995.

SCOPE

This policy applies to all members of the public who wish to stay at the Shire of Trayning Caravan Park.

Definitions

Long-term stay – in the park is for work purposes for periods of not more than one month.

Tourists - is for temporary or holiday stays usually fourteen days in any twenty eight-day period.

Permanent – residing in the caravan park for residential purposes. This is not allowable under this policy as the park does not have individual utility meters. Therefore, there is to be no exceptions.

Caravan Site Availability

- The Shire of Trayning Caravan Park consists of eight powered caravan sites. Only one Caravan per site is allowed and no more than ten persons on the site at one time.
- A minimum of seven sites must remain available to be used by as short stay at any time.
- One site is currently reserved as long term stay for workers within the Shire boundaries who have applied in writing to the CEO to stay for longer than one month and no more than three months for work purposes only.
- Should an extension be granted by the CEO, there must be a thirty-day period between the first three months and their return date.
- Tourists wishing to stay longer than fourteen days in any twenty-eight-day period will require approval from the Chief Executive Officer.
- Requests for exceptions must be addressed, in writing, to the Chief Executive Officer whose decision is final.
- The Shire of Trayning Caravan Park is not available for permanent residency.
